We will also work to expand monitoring and research to better understand what is happening to our lakes, streams, rivers, and groundwater.

Invest in Education and Collaborative Partnerships

Build and expand education programs that engage, empower, and inform our youth and communities, working to instill water stewardship values in all.

Engage in Issue-Driven Advocacy Work

Collaborate with local, state, and tribal governments, including leaders at all levels. Emphasize science-based and collaborative approaches to solving water-related issues.
